isted on the opposing page are the Top 50 Shag Songs of 2005 as compiled by the Association of Beach and Shag Club DeeJays (ABSCDJs). At the Association's Board meeting in January, 2004, it was moved and passed that this list would be compiled and distributed in the future as the official annual Top 50 list for the ABSCDJs. This list follows the annual list compiled by the late Charlie Byrd and will be dedicated to Charlie and his syndicated radio show, "The Charlie Byrd Beach Blast", as long as it is compiled and published in the Association's name. As many of you know, Charlie was always in the forefront of Beach and Shag Music and had thousands of listeners across the southeast who eagerly awaited his annual (done early each January) Top 50 show where he counted down the Top 50 shag songs of the previous year. We miss Charlie and dedicate this effort to him.

ow was this list compiled? What made the top song number one and why weren't certain other songs included on this list? The

membership of the ABSCDJs were invited to submit a list of their top 50 shag songs for the year 2005. They were given the following guidance in developing their individual lists:

- 1. What songs filled the dance floor most consistently over the year and what songs did you receive the most requests to play?
- 2. Do not overlook songs that were strong at the beginning of the year but faded towards the end. Use your subjective memory to identify and list those songs that were the strongest for you in clubs and shag club parties, over the course of the entire year.
- 3. This is a list of the Top 50 <u>SHAG</u> songs of the year. Please do not include any slow songs or line dance favorites.
- 4. This list is not a list of the Top 50 new shag songs of 2005, but of the Top 50 shag songs that <u>CONSIS-TENTLY</u> filled the floors. Therefore, feel free to include older songs from years past that you still get requests to play and that always fill the floor.

ith a total of 473 different songs submitted as being on one or more DeeJays Top 50 Shag Songs of 2005, there are obviously some great songs that did not make the cut. This just illustrates the diversity in our music and the variety of music that is out there and achieving regional popularity. And there is nothing wrong with that! Speaking personally, I've got some personal favorites that I never hear anyone else out there playing anymore, and I'm sure each of the contributing DeeJays does also. As a shagger, YOU should challenge us (the membership of the ABSCDJs) to play those great old songs that are part of the history of shag music, and by doing so, possibly introduce some of the newer members of the shag community to some great songs that they may not be familiar with.

his year there was a tie for the #50 spot on our list, so the Top 50 Shag Songs of 2005 actually has fifty-one songs on it. I felt that to list both songs was the only way to be fair to the artists.

wenty-nine members of the ABSCDJs took the time to think back over the past year and rate their top 50 songs. This was not an easy task, and took some time and soul searching in an effort to best portray the Top 50. From these twenty-nine lists, I assigned point values to each song that was submitted based on where it was ranked by the submitting DeeJay(s). For instance, if a DeeJay listed "Song A" as his number 1 song of the year, it received 50 points. His number 2 song of the year received 49, his number 3 got 48 and so on down to his number 50 song which received 1 point. Then I totaled up the points and the 50 songs receiving the most points were rank ordered as the Top 50 Shag Songs of the year.

or those interested, there were a total of 473 different songs submitted by the twenty-nine DeeJays. Of those making the Top 50, twenty-four were repeats from last year's list. Some other trivia derived from taking a close look at the lists are as follows:

- 1. The oldest (based on release date) song to make the Top 50 for 2005, as it was in 2004, was "I Used To Cry Mercy, Mercy" by The Lamplighters, released in 1954.
- 2. Twenty-one of the songs were recorded by our local beach bands and local artists, indicating their hard work at coming up with "danceable" songs for the shag world.

he twenty-nine DeeJays who took the time to participate in this effort are listed on the back page of this document. Please support them, as well as the rest of the members of the Association of Beach and Shag Club DeeJays, in the coming year. I hope you enjoy reviewing this list and dancing to the songs you see.
